The entire night of April 5th the ashramies prayed, and early in the morning they accompanied Gandhi to the sea. He dipped into the water returned to the beach,

and there picked up some salt left by the waves. Mrs. Sarojini Naidu, standing by his side cried, "Hail, Deliverer", Gandhi had broken the British law which made it a punishable crime to possess salt not obtained from the British government salt monopoly. Gandhi who had not used salt for six years, called it a "nefarious monopoly". Salt, he said is as essential as air and water, and in India all the more essential to the hard working, perspiring poor man and his beasts because of the tropical heat.
